## 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

### Inhalation

If inhaled, remove affected person from contaminated area. Keep at rest until recovered. If symptoms develop or persist seek medical attention.

### Skin

## 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

### Suitable Extinguishing Media

### Specific Hazards Arising From The Chemical

### Precautions in connection with Fire

Fire fighters should wear full protective clothing and self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) operated in positive pressure mode. Fight fire from safe location.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### Emergency Procedures

Minor spills do not normally need any special clean up measures. In the event of a large spill, prevent spillage from entering watercourses. Wear appropriate protective equipment (as listed in Section 8 of this SDS) to prevent eye and skin contamination.

Spilt material may result in a slip hazard and should be absorbed into dry, inert material to be collected in appropriately labelled containers for disposal by an approved agent according to local regulations.

Residual deposits will remain slippery, wash down with excess water. If contamination of drains or sewers occurs advise local emergency services.

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

### Precautions for Safe Handling

Avoid contact with incompatible materials. When handling DO NOT eat, drink or smoke. Keep containers closed at all times. Avoid physical damage to containers. Always wash hands with water after handling.

**Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities**

Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, out of direct sunlight. Protect from freezing. Store in suitable, labelled containers. Keep containers tightly closed. Store away from incompatible materials. Ensure that storage conditions comply with applicable local and national regulations.

## 8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS/PERSONAL PROTECTION

**Occupational exposure limit values**

No exposure standards have been established for the mixture. However, over-exposure to some chemicals may result in enhancement of pre-existing adverse medical conditions and/or allergic reactions and should be kept to the least possible levels.

**Appropriate Engineering Controls**

This substance is hazardous and should be used with a local exhaust ventilation system, drawing vapours away from workers' breathing zone. If the engineering controls are not sufficient to maintain concentrations of vapours/mists below the exposure standards, suitable respiratory protection must be worn.

**Respiratory Protection**

If engineering controls are not effective in controlling airborne exposure then an approved respirator with a replaceable mist/vapour filter should be used. Reference should be made to Australian/New Zealand Standards AS/NZS 1715, Selection, Use and Maintenance of Respiratory Protective Devices; and AS/NZS 1716, Respiratory Protective Devices, in order to make any necessary changes for individual circumstances.

**Eye Protection**

Safety glasses with full face shield should be used. Eye protection devices should conform to relevant regulations.

Eye protection should conform with Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 1337 - Eye Protectors for Industrial Applications.

**Hand Protection**

Wear gloves of impervious material {UD001}. Final choice of appropriate gloves will vary according to individual circumstances. i.e. methods of handling or according to risk assessments undertaken. Occupational protective gloves should conform to relevant regulations.

Reference should be made to AS/NZS 2161.1: Occupational protective gloves - Selection, use and maintenance.

**Body Protection**

Suitable protective workwear, e.g. cotton overalls buttoned at neck and wrist. When large quantities are handled the use of plastic aprons and rubber boots is recommended.

### Uses and Restrictions

GP4 is a neutral lemon floor cleaner and general purpose cleaner. GP4 is formulated to be used on polished floors.

Floor washing: 10ml GP4 Neutral Cleaner to 1L water

Floor Scrubbing Machines: 5mL GP4 Neutral Cleaner to 1L water or dose 50mL directly into a 10 litre detergent holding tank and top up with water.

General Cleaning: 30ml GP4 Neutral Cleaner to 1L water. Apply by spray bottle and wipe down with a cloth.

### User Information

GP4 Neutral Clean is a proprietary blend of specialised low foaming surfactants, water softening agents, anti-redeposition agents and natural orange oil as solvent booster and grease cutter. GP4 Neutral Clean has been specifically developed for use in floor scrubbing machines and manual floor washing operations on floors which have been sealed and polished with polymer based products. Carefully selected cleaning agents, combined with a buffered and neutral pH, ensure polished floors can be maintained without excessive loss of coating. GP4 Neutral Clean can be utilised as a multi-purpose detergent for cleaning of walls, bench tops, kitchen surfaces, etc.
